

Liquid Nitrogen Freezing

- Your skin lesions have been frozen with liquid nitrogen.
- The stinging sensation that occurs with this treatment can last up to two hours.
- The area treated will turn red immediately and you will notice some swelling that can last for a few days.
- The treated site should be cleansed with soap and water daily.
- It is common for a blister or blood blister to form at the treated site. Do not try to open or drain the blister. If it ruptures on its own, keep the area clean with soap and water.
- Healing usually occurs within a few weeks leaving a pink area that fades over several months. Occasionally, a permanent darkening or lightening of the skin can occur.
- Some skin growths may require more than one treatment.
